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The Parliament of the Republic of Moldova was established on May 23, 1991, by renaming the Supreme Council of the SSRM, democratically elected in 1990. The first President of the Parliament was Alexandru Moşanu.

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The Parliament is the supreme representative body of the people of the Republic of Moldova and the only legislative authority of the state.
